

Reprinted Items

Reprinted Items from the 1964, 1965, 1970, 1980, 1982, and 2003 Minutes of the Northern New Salem

- I. Year 1964 Item 15: By move and second the Association agreed to answer the request from several churches touching upon the question of sisters cutting their hair, using make-up, etc. As follows: It is the duty of every moderator of every church to exercise strict disciplinary action toward the violation of established practices. To insist on strict compliance with what sayeth the scripture concerning a woman of righteousness. Mark them that would creep in the assembly just to destroy the peace and salvation of the church.
- II. Year 1965 Item 16: That each church in our union shall hold its own key, and it is to be the sole judge of the members as long as it does not violate the Word of God, the order of the Association or Old Regular Baptist principles.
- III. Year 1970 Item 17: The request from the Little Ruth Church "Asking for advise on how should a minister who has been excluded from preaching with sects and orders contrary to Regular Baptist principles can be received back into the fellowship of a Regular Baptist Church." We as an advisory council say to all our churches that you may restore such one upon strict examination, BUT not to return to them their credentials until they have been reexamined by legal presbytery.
- IV. Year 1980 Item 12: By a motion and second, the request from the Little Rebecca Church was granted to correct Item #13 of our 1979 minutes to read as follows:
 - We, the Little Rebecca Church of Old Regular Baptist of Jesus Christ having met at our regular meeting time being found in full love and fellowship of all members present agreed unanimously to send the following request to the Northern New Salem Association when convened with the Little Ida Church on Friday before the first Saturday in August 1979. "We, the Little Rebecca Church request the Northern New Salem Association to adopt a resolution against members of our churches belong to secret orders such as Masons, Odd Fellows or any other related worldly organization that is an offense to our Sister Association as well as our own brethren". This question has produced friction far too long in our union and we feel it is contrary to our fundamental Christian beliefs and our church principles as we are not to be a part of a worldy kingdom. And farther that we advise all of our churches having such organizations. (And not preach with any preacher that belongs to a secret organization.)
- V. Year 1982-Item 13: Moved and second to grant the requests from Antioch, Family of Love, Little Ruth, and Little Rebecca Churches. Concerning omitting item number 13, page 10, year 1967 of the Northern New Salem Association minutes, and adopt item number 17, page 4 of the 1970 minutes of our mother the New Salem Association, which reads as follows: Not to use any man with two living women, (or whose wife has two living men) to preach in the bounds of the Northern New Salem Association and the Moderators to adhere to this advice. An objection was made to this move. A vote was taken, 42 voted in favor of the motion, 21 against, motion carried, request granted.

VI. Year 2003 – Item 15: A motion was made by Eld. Larry Newsome, second by Eld. Harrison Runyon that we as an adviser and counselor answer the request of the Pleasant View, Eternal Rose and True Vine Churches concerning Item #17 of our 2002 Minutes. The following will replace Item #17:

"We say to our churches to advise their ministers to refrain from taking any part in the services of churches not in correspondence with the Northern New Salem Association. This means preaching or baptizing members into their fellowship. If this is violated the minister will be silenced for a period of time, satisfactory to his home church. Under no circumstance will this be less than twelve (12) months for the first offense, and if this should happen a second time he would automatically be excluded. Concerning funerals: If a family wants a minister of the Old Regular Baptist faith to participate in a funeral service where another church minister (not of our correspondence) is going to take part or be used in part of the services. This is acceptable as long as the Regular Baptist minister separates the services by song, prayer and dismission called. See Item #17 of our 1970 Minutes. This advice is to be printed in our Minutes until future action is taken.

Friday, August 2, 2024

It was a cloudy, breezy morning as the brothers and sisters began to gather in to the pavilion of the Little Angel Church. After several minutes of hugs, handshakes, and deep embraces the brethren called for a song. **Elder Theodore Slon**e of the New Salem association began to line *Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah*. As the voices of the brothers and sisters began to join in this song of Zion you could feel the joy from the congregation. After a few more songs, our beloved moderator **Elder Ray Hamilton** came to the stand to welcome everyone to this our 66th Association.

Alternate, **Elder Zachariah Collins** was called on to introduce the services. **Elder Zachariah Collins** came to the stand in a humble way. He was soon blessed to preach of Jesus being the light that shines in a dark place. You could see the tears as he preached of a grandmother that advised him not to turn away the Lord when he calls. From that message, he was soon blessed to preach of his experience and the need to preach repentance. Having been chosen by the delegates at our 2023 session to preach the Introductory Sermon for this year **Elder William B. Holbrook** approached the stand rejoicing and stating that he could not be nervous because he was in the presence of God's people. He was soon blessed to preach of a God that can heal the blind and raise the dead. His closing remarks were that he was looking forward to the day he could see God with his own eyes and in that day, he would truly be satisfied.

Those who were not delegates were asked to remain at the pavilion where the preaching would be conducted. The delegates were advised to assemble in the sanctuary of the Little Angel Church where the business of the Association would begin. The following Elders were chosen to preach at the place arranged:

Elders:

- (1) Estill Hamilton- *Union Association*;
- (2) Brian Adams- New Salem Association.
- (3) Danny Justice-Old Friendship Association;
- (4) Gary Blevins- Philadelphia Association; and
- (5) Danny Adams- Union Association.

After gathering in the house and singing one of Zion's songs, **Elder Theodore Slone-** *New Salem Association* was called on to make remarks and Elder James Tackett- *New Salem Association* led in prayer.

Our beloved Moderator, *Elder Ray Hamilton*, announced that the 66th Annual Session of the Northern New Salem Association was now ready to begin the work of the Association.

a) The Assistant Moderator called for the letters from the churches that compose the Northern New Salem Association to be handed to the Clerk. The letter from the Little Angel Church was read by the Clerk. A motion was made by Brother Raymond Henderson, second by **Elder Steven Miller** to receive the letters, seat the delegates, and refer all queries and requests to the Committee on Arrangements

- b) The moderator then called on the Assistant Clerk, **Elder Wayne Sartin** to read the letter of resignation from the Clerk, Elder Hillard Newsome. A motion was made by **Elder Danny Carty** and seconded by **Brother Jimmy Sowards** to accept the resignation and to Name Elder Hillard Newsome Honorary Clerk of Northern New Salem Association for the remainder of his life. (See page 32 for a printing of the letter)
- c) The Northern New Salem Association of Old Regular Baptist faith organized by electing the following officers to serve the next year. The following Brothers were appointed to take the vote: Elder Jimmy Dale Sanders Union Association, Elder Tommy Dials Sardis Association, and Elder Roger Hicks New Salem Association

- i. Noted by the Association concerning our Finance Committee. It was moved and seconded that our Finance Committee be appointed at the same time of the election of officers, the Moderator appointed: Elder Chucky Hall- New Salem Association, Elder Richard Staton- Sardis Association, and Elder Teddy Honaker- New Salem Association. Elder Bill Smith made a motion, second by Elder Ishmael Hall Jr. to receive the report of the committee appointed and discharge them of their duties.
- c) By a motion made by **Elder William B. Holbrook**, second by **Elder Daniel Newsome**, the Moderator was authorized to make all temporary appointments. Elder Ray Hamilton then appointed **Elder Jason Hagerman** as the Second Assistant Clerk of the Northern New Salem Association.
- d) Brother Moderator called on the clerks to read the Constitution, Rules of Decorum, and the Articles of Faith. (In compliance with Item 10, Saturday's work 2022 NNSA)
- e) Called for legally organized churches of our same faith and order desiring to join our union, and none responded.
- f) Called for Associations of our same faith and order desiring to continue a Godly correspondence, and the following responded by letter and delegate:
 - i. New Salem-- Represented by the following delegates: Brian Adams, Randy Combs, Eric Lawson, John Cremeans, Abe Howell, Dan Samons, Gordon Boyd, Bobby Hamilton, Kennith Johnson, Jimmy Dye, Chuck Hall, Theodore Slone, Deffort

Thornsberry, James Tackett, Tony Roberts, Teddy Honaker, Ray Moore, Tommy Bentley, and Roger Hicks. Letter in the hand of Elder James Tackett. A motion was made by **Elder Larry Newsome** and second by **Brother James Wagner** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.

- ii. Union--Represented by the following delegates: Dennis Elkins, Jeffrey Little, Estill Hamilton, Barry Lucas, Bobby Johnson, Jimmy Dale Sanders, Jeff Dillon, Danny Adams, Mike Justice, and Alger Newsome. Letter in the hand of Elder Mike Justice. A motion was made by **Brother Rodney Slone** and second by **Brother Raymond Henderson** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
- iii. Philadelphia--Represented by the following delegates: Robert Adkins, Dallas Bledsoe Jr., Gary Adkins, Gary Adkins Jr., Gary Blevins, Homer Ruggles, Lowell Adkins, Darrell Kidd, Skeeter Pridemore, Wayne Caudill, Nate Caudill, Lee Blevins Jr., John Elkins, Paul D. Moore, Preston Lewis, and Scott Adkins. Letter in the hand of Brother Gary Adkins Jr. A motion was made by **Elder Ishmael Hall Jr.** and second by **Brother Jimmy Sowards** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
- iv. Sardis--Represented by the following delegates: Hobart Hamilton, Thomas J. Dials, Richard Staton, Marion Duncan, Alvin Thornbury, Leonard Napier, Butler Fletcher, Buster Hall, Arthur Mathis, Richie Hale, and Sam Frye. Letter in the hand of Elder Richard Staton. A motion was made by Brother Jack Dials and second by Elder Danny Carty to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
- v. Old Friendship Represented by the following delegates: Gary Estep, Edgar Baker Jr., Larry Mullins, David Lester, Roger Baker, Allen Hunt, Tarzan Justus, Austin Mullins, Cody Justus, Danny C. Justus, and Andrew Ford. Letter in the hand of Brother Edgar Baker Jr. A motion was made by **Elder Andy Fields** and second by **Elder William B. Holbrook** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.
- vi. Old Indian Bottom-- Represented by the following delegates: Jeff Lewis, Aaron Whitaker Jr., Delmer Jones, Luke Haynes, Nick Plowman, Kevin Blevins, Denver Bacic, Travis Lewis, and Robbie Cordle. Letter in the hand of Brother Robbie Cordle. A motion was made by **Elder Sean Hicks** and second by **Brother Ralph Manuel** to receive the letter and seat the delegates with us in council by the right hand of fellowship.

The Moderator appointed a committee consisting of the delegates from the Little Angel Church together with one delegate from each of the other churches, to arrange the ministers for Friday evening and Saturday morning, who reported as follows:

Friday evening — (1) Brother John Cremeans-New Salem Association (2)Elder Deffort Thornsberry-New Salem; (3) Elder Mike Justice- Union.

Saturday morning—Elders (1) Elder Teddy Honaker-New Salem; (2) Elder Danny Adams- Union Association (3) Elder Barry Lucas -Union Association; (4) Elder Tommy Dials- Sardis Association; and (5) Elder Roger Hicks- New Salem Association.

- g) Called for transient ministers and members of our same faith and order and none responded.
- h) A motion was made by **Elder Steven Miller**, second by **Elder Larry Newsome** that we, the Northern New Salem Association, correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations: (a) New Salem; (b) Union (c) Philadelphia; (d) Sardis; (e) Old Friendship; and (f) Old Indian Bottom.
- i) Due to no requests other than to host the 2025 Association coming in, the Moderator advised the association that they should allow the clerks to prepare the Bill of Arrangements for Saturday.
 - a. **Brother Ralph Manual** made a motion, second by **Elder Ishmael Hall, Jr.** that we, the Northern New Salem Association, adjourn until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, August 3, 2024.

Saturday, August 3, 2024

Per having met pursuant to adjournment, the Association delegates and attendees reconvened at the Little Angel Church on the second day of three of the Northern New Salem Association.

As the sanctuary of the Little Angel Church began to fill, Elder Preston Lewis began to line "I Can Almost See Heaven From Here". The sound of the brothers and sisters' voices joined in that glorious song of Zion was truly music to the soul. You could feel the glorious spirit of God flow from breast to breast as the brothers continued to line "I Love My Savior God" and "Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah.

Elder Hillard Newsome came to the stand to announce the arrangements for the morning. Services for the morning were introduced by Elder Kerry Ratliff of the New Salem Association. A song was called for and then a humble prayer was offered by Elder James Tackett of the New Salem Association.

- 1. Called the roll of delegates and marked the absentees.
- 2. The Clerk read the Bill of Arrangements. A motion was made by **Elder Phillip Beverly** and seconded by **Brother James Wagner** to receive the Bill of Arrangements and discharge the committee.
- 3. The Circular Letter written by **Elder Sean Hicks** for our 2024 session was read. A motion was made by **Elder Wayne Sartin** and seconded by **Elder Patrick Deel** to receive the letter and have it printed in our 2024 minutes. Objections were called for, and none responded. (Circular Letter on page 13)
- 4. The Finance Committee appointed Friday, Item 2(a), consisting of Elder Teddy Honaker New Salem Association, Elder Chuck Hall- New Salem Association, and Elder Richard Staton- Sardis Association reported as follows:

Brother Ralph Manuel made a motion, seconded by **Brother Mathew Jones** to receive the Treasurer's Report.

- 6. **Elder Scott Little** made a motion, and **Elder Billy Miller** seconded the motion that Elder Wayne Sartin be appointed recording secretary. He is to have 1405 copies of the current minutes printed and distributed among the churches according to their contributions. The secretary is to receive \$0.00 for his services. The printer's fee is to appear on the front cover.
- 7. The brothers appointed to take the vote for who is to preach the Introductory Sermon: Elder Estill Hamilton-Union Association; Elder David Lester Old Friendship Association; Elder Danny Justus, Old Friendship Association; and who is to write the Circular Letter: Elder Jeff Little, Union Association; Elder Richard Staton, Sardis Association, Elder Chuck Hall, New Salem Association for 2025.

Saturday evening services were cancelled so the brothers and sisters could rest.

The following ministers were chosen to preach on Sunday morning:

(1) Elder Danny Carty -Northern New Salem (2) Elder Jason Hagerman- Northern New Salem Association, (3) Elder Scott Little- Northern New Salem Association, (4) Elder Wayne Sartin – Northern New Salem Association, (5) Elder Scott Hamilton- Northern New Salem Association, and (6) Elder Ray Hamilton- Northern New Salem Association.

By a vote of the delegates, **Elder Steven Slone** was chosen to preach the Introductory Sermon, **Elder Ishmael Hall** to be his alternate, and **Elder Jason Hagerman** to write the Circular Letter for our 67th Annual Session.

- 8. In compliance with Item 7 of Friday's work, we, the Northern New Salem Association, agreed to correspond by letter and delegate with the following associations:
 - (a) New Salem: When convened with the host churches, to be held at the Association Building, Minnie, Floyd County, KY. Beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in September 2024 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Danny Carty, Scott Little, Jason Hagerman, Ishmael Hall Jr., Eugene Couch, Ray Hamilton, and Larry Newsome. Letter in the hand of Elder Jason Hagerman.
 - (b) Union: When convened with the host churches and cohost churches. To be held at the Association Building, Ashcamp, Pike County, KY. Beginning on Friday before the third Saturday in September 2024 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Scott Little, Ray Hamilton, Scott Hamilton, Jason Hagerman, and Larry Newsome. Letter in the hand of Elder Scott Little.
 - (c) Philadelphia: When convened with the host church at the Association Building, at 522 5th Ave., Worthington, KY. Beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in August 2024 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Jimmy King, Danny Carty, Scott Little, Patrick Deel, Matthew Jones, Eugene Couch, Ray Hamilton, and Phillip Beverly. Letter in the hand of Elder Danny Carty.
 - (d) Sardis: When convened with the host church and cohosting churches at the permanent association building, Varney, KY, beginning on Friday before the second Saturday in September, 2024 and the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Danny Carty, Jason Hagerman, Ray Hamilton, and Scott Hamilton. Letter is in the hand of Elder Wayne Sartin.

- (e) Old Friendship: When convened with the host church and co-host churches at the Pine Grove Church beginning on Friday before the fourth Saturday in August 2024 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Adam Moore, Billy Miller, Ray Hamilton, and Scott Hamilton. Letter in the hand of Elder Scott Hamilton.
- (f) Old Indian Bottom: When convened with the host church Doty Creek and co-host Terrell's Creek Church at the Association Building at the Old Indian Bottom Church, Cornettsville, KY beginning on Friday before the first Saturday in September, 2024 and continuing the two following days. Delegates to attend: Wayne Sartin, Patrick Deel, Ray Hamilton, and Scott Little. Letter in the hand of Elder Wayne Sartin.
- 9. The request to host the 2024 association from the Rose of Sharon Church was read. A motion was made by Elder Larry Newsome seconded by Elder Phillip Beverly to grant the request of the Rose of Sharon Church the honor of hosting and the Little Ida Church to co-host the 2024 setting of this blessed old association
- 10. **Elder Ishmael Hall Jr.** made a motion, seconded by Brother James Wagner to forego the reading of the current minutes.
- 11. A motion was made by **Elder Danny Carty** seconded by **Brother Ralph Manuel** to adjourn to the place and time mentioned in Item 15 of Saturday's work in the current minutes.

The 66th Session was closed out by Elder Kevin Blevins of the Old Indian Bottom Association. He came and spoke and then Elder David Lester closed out the association in a humble prayer.

Sabbath Morning, August 6, 2024

On this the final day of our 66th Annual association, you could feel the spirit flowing in the sanctuary of the Little Angel Church. Elder Danny Carty began lining "Oh Had I Some Secret Place" and you could feel the joy of the assembly as their voices began to blend into a song of praise. As the service continued, Elder Patrick Deel began to line, "Poor and Afflicted" and the spirit was truly flowing from breast to breast. 
- 1. Elder Danny Carty introduced the services and led in prayer

"He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings." **Psalms 40:2.**

I am so thankful that I can say for myself; "And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of my master Abraham, who hath not left destitute my master of his mercy and his truth: I being in the way, the LORD led me to the house of my master's brethren." **Genesis 24:27**. ARTICLE 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin, and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore a Savior is needed for redemption.

Gen. 3:6, Romans 5:12

ARTICLE 5. We believe that sinners are called to repentance, and believe in the gospel, and regeneration of the soul, sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, and none such shall fall away and be lost.

Prov. 8:4, Matt. 9:13, Mark 2:17, 2nd Tim. 2:9, 1st Peter 1:23

ARTICLE 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

2nd Tim. 1:9, Luke 18:13-14, Acts 13:39

ARTICLE 7. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's church on Earth, and the mode is IMMERSION back foremost so as to cover all over.

Matt. 3:13-16, John 1:31-33, Romans 6-4, Eph. 4:5

ARTICLE 8. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Savior, and that by the use of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine and feet-washing should be kept up until His second coming, by His believers.

Matt. 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25, Luke 22:20, John 13:7-8, 1st Tim. 5:9-10

ARTICLE 9. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust, and that the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.

John 5:28-29, 1st Cor. 15:51-53, Luke 24:46

ARTICLE 10. We believe that no minister has a right to administer the ordinances and commands of the gospel, except such as are regular baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the gospel, and has come under the hands of a regular chosen presbytery of the church and ordained thereby.

Acts 13:2-3, Romans 1:6, Titus 1:5-9

ARTICLE 11. We believe that it is the duty of all church members to contribute money for defraying all reasonable expenses of the church, never forgetting the poor, according to their several abilities.

Acts 11:29, Romans 15:26, 1st Cor. 16:1-2

ARTICLE 12. We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage, or indulge people in their sins, or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation, is erroneous, and such doctrine will be rejected by us.

Matt. 16:12, Acts 8:16-21, Romans 16:17-18, Eph. 4:14-15, Gal. 1:8-10

ARTICLE 13. We believe that the church of Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ, who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and with one another, and have given themselves to the Lord, and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline, according to the rules of the gospel.

Acts 2:42, 1st John 1:3

ARTICLE 14. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the church, and the government thereof is upon his shoulders.

Isaiah 9:6-7, Ch. 22:21-22, Luke 1:33

ARTICLE 15. We believe that a sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and a woman only. We also believe in receiving members into our fellowship that follow the natural dating relationship that leads to holy matrimony between a man and a woman only; thereby, preserving the family unit of father, mother, and children.

Eph. 5:22, 23, 28, St. Mark 10:6-8, Romans 1:26, 27

ARTICLE 16. None of the articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation, so as to make God partial directly, indirectly, or to injure any of the children of men; nor shall any of these articles be altered without legal notice, and free consent.

John 3:16, Heb. 2:9

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTHERN NEW SALEM ASSOCIATION ORGANIZED IN 1957

From a long series of experiences we, the Old Regular Baptist Church of Jesus Christ, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

ARTICLE I. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.

ARTICLE II. In the letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.

ARTICLE III. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the union.

ARTICLE IV. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.

ARTICLE V. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.

ARTICLE VI. New Churches may be admitted into this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.

ARTICLE VII. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.

ARTICLE VIII. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.

ARTICLE IX. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with Minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE X. We think it necessary that we should have an Association fund for defraying expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.

ARTICLE XI. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.

ARTICLE XII. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.

ARTICLE XIII. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.

ARTICLE XIV. All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by will of a majority of the delegates present, except in receiving and dismissing churches and Associations which shall be by a unanimous vote.

ARTICLE XV. The Association shall have the power for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of

difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent them at any time in the Association; to appropriate money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any members, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviates from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to a seat with us; The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. The Association shall have a moderator, an assistant moderator, clerk, and assistant clerk, each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- 3. Only one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as to make remarks on his slips of imperfections but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can as to convey his ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.
- 7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association.
- 8. No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term of appellation than that of "Brother".
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any members from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the rules of decorum.
- 11. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Moderator requires.
- 12. The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member provided the chair be filled. And he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- 13. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.

Her six siblings: Lula, Ruth, stillborn twin boys, 3-year-old Raymond, and Jonas "Lawrence" Slone Jr. have all passed away and are buried on the family cemetery. Lawrence's wife, Geraldine [Holbrooks] Slone, plus loving nieces, nephews, and cousins are the only remaining family.

As a teenager, Marjorie was responsible for helping to improve the road past her birthplace through a letter-writing campaign to The Honorable Carl D. Perkins, Democrat for the 7th congressional district of Kentucky for 35 years. He was well-acquainted with her family since he frequently was a dinner guest

at their home.

She and Omer Edwin Slone eloped on August 5, 1946, and were married 53 years until he passed away on Dec. 15, 1999. They had 2 children: Douglas Edmund Slone of New Port Richey, FL who passed away October 28, 2023, and Belinda Gayle Slone Elliott of Elyria. Belinda gave Marjorie one grandson in her marriage to Basil Elliott: Chad [married to Lisa McKee] and 2 great grandchildren: Tyler and Ashley.

She married Donel Gibson on June 22, 2002, who brought 6 "bonus" children to their marriage: Brenda [Feldon] Ruggles, Gerald [Valerie], Allen [Sonja], twins Joe [Sandy] and Mark [Rita], and Donnie [Diana] plus many beautiful grandchildren and great grandchildren. No "bonus family" could have treated her better, even after Don passed away on November 18, 2019.

When Don and Marjorie moved into the condo community where all his outside work was done for him, Don insisted that Marjorie have help with her inside work so he hired a cleaning lady and took all his dress shirts to the cleaners. When they got married, Chad's son Tyler was only about 3 years old, and he nicknamed him "New Don." Don was generous and patient with Marjorie, and he often winked at Belinda and said, "Let the little girl dance," when Marjorie was testing his patience! Don treated her better than he needed to, and he treated Doug and Belinda and their families like his own children and grandchildren. Don was especially kind and generous to Belinda during a difficult time in her life.

Marjorie also leaves behind many church friends and extended family who lovingly called her Sister Marge, Mom, Aunt Marjorie, and Grandma. I believe she was the oldest member of Pleasant View Church, both in age, spiritual birth, and membership. Since she was the "matriarch" of the church, everyone gave her love, respect and honor for it. She and Omer traveled widely, visiting churches and association meetings in Michigan, Indiana, and Kentucky.

Marjorie attended high school at Wayland, KY through 11th grade until 1945. She had skipped two elementary grades. She was a lifelong learner who loved to read. She read mostly inspirational and religious materials. She wanted to be a nutritionist, and studied everything she could to live a healthier life. She called herself a "paper person" because she loved to write letters and send cards. She remembered more birthdays than anyone! The best gifts you could have given her were postage stamps and stationery.

Marjorie became a believer in Jesus Christ on July 8, 1952, at age 22. Later she went back to KY to the Caney Fork Church to be baptized where her family had attended for several generations. Since 1953, she and Dad had lived in Ohio, so she moved her membership to the only church in northern Ohio at the time: Little Rebecca Church in Plymouth, OH, and then closer to home to Pleasant View Church in Litchfield, OH, where she served with Omer when he was ordained as deacon in 1981 and later serving with Don as a supportive elder's wife. She was present when the Northern New Salem Association was established, and present to see many new churches added to the group.

She read everything she could get her hands on to help her grow in the grace of God, and when she could not go to church, she watched her favorite TV preachers. Marjorie and Omer both disagreed with many manmade rules, practices, and traditions of their church, but they made a conscious decision to "go along to get along" with the friends they loved. She believed there should be childcare for babies and preschoolers, and that school-age children should be taught Bible stories rather than expected to sit still and be quiet for hours when even adults cannot do so. She especially believed that there should be Bible teaching and not just preaching. She often said, "How else will they know the Word of God if they don't read it themselves or hear it clearly taught?"

Marjorie worked hard to be a good church member, friend, sister, cousin, aunt, wife, mother, and grandma. She was a lifelong homemaker. She did occasional jobs to supplement their income, and for a brief time, she even worked in Bono's, Doug's pizza shop in LaGrange. She learned to do embroidery and machine sewing; Belinda remembers several pretty dresses she made for her. She canned vegetables from their garden every year, and kept their house immaculate. She had learned to be resourceful and frugal when she was a young wife and mother, utilizing inexpensive things around the house. She used to cut out pictures from magazines and put them in cheap frames for wall décor. In addition, Marjorie wrote a special interest column for the Mountain Eagle newspaper in KY for many years.

Her love language was giving gifts so she tried hard to give exactly what she thought others needed or liked. And that meant she loved receiving gifts, especially knick-knacks. She never forgot who gave her each item, and she could go through her house and tell you who gave it, when and why. She was known for remembering birthdays with a card!

She always liked to wear pretty clothes and jewelry, and she wanted her house to be decorated for every season and holiday, especially Christmas. Her tree was decorated with extreme care in blue and white, and it was always stunning. She insisted on leaving her snowmen on display until spring arrived. Before she moved into the condo community with all its strict rules, she loved tending her beautiful flower gardens.

She and Omer were CornerStone Academy's cleaning crew and adopted grandparents, and on Appalachian Day, she came as Minnie Pearl down to the last detail. To Omer's utter frustration, she stayed in character all day. The kids loved it, especially the complete country breakfast Marjorie and Belinda cooked for the whole school.

She especially loved the ladies in her weekly "Lunch Bunch" – Cousin Ollie Terry, Granny Lizzie Collins, and Aunt Hazel Maynard. She was well-known in the community, and everywhere Belinda went – to the pharmacy, the dry cleaners, the grocery store, or their favorite restaurants - she was asked, "How's your mother?" When she answered that Mom wasn't doing well, there were tears, the offer of prayers, and even an offer of her favorite homemade food.

She loved playing tricks on people on April Fool's Day, particularly on her father-in-law Elmer Slone. Once she was ready to be discharged from hospital and Omer was at work. She called her father-in-law, but he refused to go because it was April Fool's Day! She also had a cute sense of humor about ordinary things.

She adored her grandchildren and great grandchildren, and she made everyone think they were her special favorites. Truth is they were ALL her favorites! If she discovered you liked something, you would get it ... often. Chad used to say, "Grandma has sugar in her hands. That's what made her food taste so good!" And no other hands were as tender and comforting!

Marjorie Slone Gibson was a loved, blessed and highly favored child of God. She had many spiritual gifts, such as being a prayer warrior, an exhorter and encourager, a leader, a teacher, a helper, and a generous giver. She exemplified all nine of the fruit of the spirit mentioned in Galatians 5:22-23. As a believer since age 22, clearly she had grown in grace, but not because she sat in church two or three times a month. She grew because she made the effort, seven days a week, to study the Word of God. She could have stayed a spiritually ignorant baby, but she always wanted to have a closer walk with God and, more than anything, to share her faith with others, believers and unbelievers alike. She often quoted Jesus's words, "By my loving kindness have I drawn thee."

In April 2024, she asked to say a few words at the end of the church service. She thanked everyone for their loving visits, calls, delicious food, cards and gifts they had sent. She said "farewell until we meet again in the resurrection," urged everyone to love each other, not to judge, and she especially instructed non-believers to quickly respond to Jesus's offer of the gift of eternal life, by grace through faith.

On Sunday morning, August 11, 2024, only 11 days from her 94^{th} birthday, God received her back to heaven where the Bible says, she is "asleep in Jesus." Rest in peace, Marjorie, and we will see you again real soon. Written with love, Belinda



Darren was a lifetime resident of Sullivan, Ohio, a graduate of Black River and owner of Whites Machining & Tool, Inc.


